Position Description & Expectations

Core Values and General Purpose for the Provincial Youth Ministry Network

- Promote, encourage and advocate for youth ministry in provinces and dioceses of The Episcopal Church
- Develop leaders - facilitate connections with resources and provide collegial support
- Celebrate diversity of cultures and experience with faithful intentionality
- Recognize potential for transformation through spiritual growth and mission
- Commit to relational ministry in all levels of our mission and ministry
- Commit to evangelism and discipleship in all that we do

Commitments of Time*

- 1-3 meetings per year
 - Typically three or four weekdays long, including travel
 - Travel, lodging and meals provided
- Staffing for Episcopal Youth Event
 - May include additional design team meetings
 - Triennial event approximately one week in length
 - Travel, lodging and meals provided
- Staffing for Official Youth Presence at General Convention
 - Additional spring training/orientation meeting prior to GC
 - Allow 10 days for General Convention
- Additional projects and/or events as discerned

Commitments of Connectivity

- Maintain updated list of diocesan youth ministry contacts to share with Officer for Youth Ministries and the staff at the Episcopal Church Center
- Serve as conduit for communication between diocesan and regional networks and the Formation and Vocation Ministries Team of The Episcopal Church Center staff
- Be familiar with Episcopal resources for Youth Formation, especially on The Episcopal Church website and those of TEC's affiliated organizations and allies
- Serve as a Council of Advice for the Youth Ministries Officer

Commitments of Giftedness

- Ability to build collaborative community quickly
- Self-motivated and clear communicator
- Demonstrated experience in congregational level youth ministry
- Leadership and facilitation skills in large and small groups

**It is preferable that Provincial Youth Ministry Coordinator's serve on a diocesan or congregational staff where they are permitted to take time away for network meetings and events without needing to take personal vacation days.*
