Today, the First Sunday of Lent, the Church celebrates Episcopal Relief & Development Sunday. Lent was designated by the 2009 General Convention of The Episcopal Church as a time for remembering Episcopal Relief & Development's work to heal a hurting world. Although the first Sunday in Lent is the official day of observance, congregations may hold a special service on any Sunday.

"I urge all congregations to devote the first Sunday in Lent to reflecting on the life-giving work of Episcopal Relief & Development and giving meaningfully to support this vital ministry," Presiding Bishop Curry said. "As the season of Lent calls us to re-examine our priorities, let's unite in truly seeking and serving Christ in all persons, through the important work of Episcopal Relief & Development."

"Episcopal Relief & Development Sunday is a special opportunity to bring prayerful support of our work and that of our partners into your worship," said Sean McConnell, Episcopal Relief & Development's Senior Director of Engagement.
